Supervisor Horr called the Year-End meeting to order at 5:00pm. Roll call was taken, and found Councilperson Infantino, Bacon, Luce and were present. Also present was Town Supervisor Gregory Horr, and Highway Superintendent Scott Mitchell. Absent: Councilperson Colella.

Pledge to the Flag followed, led by Councilperson Bacon

Privilege of the Floor: Nancy Nice Planning Board Chairperson addressed the Town Board regarding the status of the Comprehensive Plan for the Town and Village. She stated the committee has been meeting for almost two years. She updated the board on the progress they have made, and the areas they have been working on. Grant status is postponed because they do not have a working budget yet. Nancy stated that Livingston County attended with a presentation. They gave the committee a figure of \$100,000, but no proposal. MRB also attended a meeting but gave no figure or proposal. There was a presentation by a nonprofit called PIVOT, and they gave a breakdown of services and a figure from them. They will assemble tools for gathering and analyzing public input, including an online survey, personal interviews, in person meetings and review sessions. The non-profit group will write the plan accepting draft sections from the Comprehensive Plan Work Group. The figure they gave to do this was \$20,000. The Work Group has access to the Nunda Planning Board Chairperson for assistance. They have been working on their plan since before Covid, and just recently started to get back into it.

Nancy says they have been advertising on Facebook, penny saver free community section, radio community calendar, Village and Town boards. They need to start advertising in a newspaper, but the group had concerns that the Town uses the Spectator as their official paper and does not feel it is adequate to reach Dansville residents. The Spectator is the official newspaper for the town as it is a daily print, and the deadlines for publication are easier to meet than the Livingston County News, which is a once-a-week print.

CPWG is requesting a \$3,000 budget from the Town and Village for advertising purposes. Nancy requested the Town change their official newspaper to Livingston County News. The Town is unable to meet the publication deadlines with LCN so they cannot change that to their official newspaper. The board agreed to place an advertisement in the LCN posting the dates of the CPWG meetings (3<sup>rd</sup> Monday at 6:00pm).

A motion by Councilperson Bacon and a second by Luce to approve the regular meeting minutes from December 09, 2025, regular meeting. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

Justice report from Justice Werth for the month of November 2025 was presented, copy on file. The report shows money taken in for the month was \$15,492.00. A motion by Councilperson Bacon and a second by Infantino to accept the report as presented. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

A motion by Councilperson Bacon and a second by Luce to pay all bills as audited, General Account Vouchers #279- #290 incl., totaling \$6,316.88, and Highway Account Vouchers # 93- #94 incl., totaling \$1,330.87.

A motion by Councilperson Bacon and a second by Luce to adjourn the meeting at 5:37pm. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.
